



It is lovely to see the children back at school and eager to learn.

The Curious Quest has begun with the Faithful Friends requesting our help with speech marks. The children have found out what they are used for and have had a go at using them in their writing. Amazingly, we unlocked the gate and now our friends are crossing the malevolent mountains. The 'Stinky Cheeseman' by Jon Scieszka and Lane Smith is the story that we have been innovating. The children have been learning some top tier vocabulary and some have even been trying to use it in their writing.

In maths, reception have been focussing on pairs and number bonds to ten. While, year 1 and 2 have been learning about multiplication. They have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, and year 2 have has the added challenge of counting in 3s.

We were lucky this week to have some great weather for PE, and we have started our new PE units which are: tag rugby and racket sports. We've been learning about attacking and defending as well as balance, control and the importance of always watching the ball.

In science, the children have begun their unit on Weather and the Season. This is a fabulous topic and will ensure that the children get lots of opportunities to make and measure different types of weather.

Welcome back class 2, it is lovely to see you all back in the classroom. Our learning over the next few weeks has some lovely cross curricular links, with our English work looking at a hybrid text on the rainforest and Geography focusing on biomes and climates. The children will all be experts by the end.

Within English this week the class have broken down the book 'Rainforests Rough Guide.' This has allowed them to fully understand the different features used in non-fiction books and the importance they play in the reader being able to easily access the information. We had some fun trying to use the contents and index pages of non-fiction books to find particular pieces of information.

I was very impressed at the children's recall of prior knowledge in Geography on Tuesday. They have already shown a good understanding of biomes and are eager to explore more about each of them and their climates.

Year 3 are looking at length and perimeter in math over the next couple of weeks and have had the opportunity to take out the meter sticks and tape measures to practice their measuring skills around the school. This will come in handy when they're making their photo frames in D&T. Year 6 have also started a new maths topic, decimals. Remembering tenths are greater than thousandths has been key in helping them complete their work.

Swimming continues for a few more weeks and with the nice weather the class have also been able to start playing badminton and work on their hand (racquet) - eye coordination.

Until...

at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over 48 hours after their last episode	
48 hours after their last episode	
they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the nationa guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-1	
their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hour after they started antibiotics	
4 days after the rash first appeared	
5 days after the swelling started	
they've had their first treatment

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- · Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
