Class 1 - Mrs Betts

In Curious Quest this week the children have been writing their adventure stories based around '*The Big Pancake*' by Vera Southgate. This follows on from our fairy stories and traditional tales unit of work. The children invented their own food character and setting. Using their world book day character as the hero of their story.

In maths, reception have been learning about shape and finding them in their environments. KS1 have been learning about arrays and how they can help us with multiplication.

We visited the church on Thursday to meet the vicar. He spoke to us about the lead up to Easter and explained to the children the meaning of Ash Wednesday. We hope that this will be the first of many visits.

World Book Day was wonderful and it was lovely to see so many characters turning up for school on Thursday morning. We shared stories across the school, created bookmarks, lots of cooking and even had time for a bit of drama – re-enacting some well-loved stories.

Class 2- Mrs Miali

We have delved deeper into the rainforest through our English text this week, with the children using formal and informal language to write diary entries and emails about an opportunity to visit the Amazon Rainforest. They have used a combination of coordinating and subordinating conjunctions to link clauses together and make their writing more relevant.

With the appearance of the sun we have been able to take our geography learning outside this week. Exploring the features of our natural environment allowed the class to identify the biome that we live within and understand how it differs from others. They wrote a report detailing the evidence found to support why we are part of the temperate forest.

The good weather has also aided our science, talking about light sources and the sun being our main natural source of light. The children had some interesting deliberations about the moon and whether or not it is a light source or a reflector of light.

The week at Kings Nympton ended with World book day and it was fantastic to see all of the class dress up as a book character. They have explored what makes a book good and want to read it and have applied this to creating their own book cover and blurb, staring themselves as the main character. They have also produced some amazing illustrations, guided by Quinten Blake, of the infamous Willy Wonka from Roald Dahls' Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.

FUNDRAISING



On Thursday 13th March 2025 we will welcome Kirsty Way as our Sports for Champions athlete.

Every child has been given a sponsorship form to try and help raise funds which will be split between the federation (60%) and the athlete (40%). The whole school will have the opportunity to ask questions and participate in a fitness circuit with Kirsty Way. She is a European champion in double mini trampolining (DMT). This is a fantastic opportunity for a lot of children to learn about a sport they otherwise might not get to engage with and hear the story of an athlete on their journey to try and achieve success. Kirsty has strong links with other aspects of gymnastics and will spend time with each class throughout the morning.

The form given explains more information regarding the event itself and some rewards available for certain amounts of sponsorships. A child will still be able to participate in the event without sponsorship. Our previous events funds have helped us purchase new equipment like goals and basketball hoops as well maintaining our playgrounds and subsidising trips and events throughout the academic year.

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- · Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
