

In Maths we completed our learning on place value to 50. We are now working on length and height which will include lots of fun practical activities.

In maths we continue to work with fractions, and hope to finish them next week.

We have continued to develop our core values and have been working on underpinning them in everything we do.









Year 4—Mr Walter

Firstly, well done to all of Year 4 for their fantastic engagement towards our Sports for Champions event yesterday. There were lots of smiles and amazing questions about the journey our athlete Kirsty Way had been on.

In English, our writing has been focussed on including prepositions to describe certain animals in paragraphs whilst also using apostrophes for contractions and possession.

In maths, we have been adding and subtracting fractions. Challenging ourselves by doing this with a whole number.

Our history learning explored the similarities and differences between holidays in the 20th century and today. Whereas in science we investigated the differences between size, pitch and volume.

Finally, it was lovely to get on the field in our cricket sequence to further develop our cricket skills in a game format, gaining understanding of when to run and stop.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

An exciting week in Year 5! In Maths we have been finding the perimeter and area of different shapes and have been challenging ourselves to find the area of compound shapes.

In English, we have continued our sequence using our book Cloud Busting and have been writing our own poems in the pattern of the book. We created our own BIG MISTAKE! poems. The children thought about a mistake that they had made and created a poem around that mistake. We have also been focusing on recapping events from the book and the children have created their own newspaper report about the "diary disaster."

In History, we have been learning about what made the Vikings successful in their invasion and have created our own information booklet detailing their tactics, inventions and resourcefulness'.

In PE, we have continued our sequences on cricket and badminton, the children have enjoyed focusing on different skills of the games and applying these into game situations. On Thursday the children really enjoyed Kirsty Way coming in and sharing her knowledge and skills with the children.

Year 6—Miss McLean

Year six have put a lot of effort into their music lessons this week, learning to play a range of instruments ready for our Future Musicians event next week. On Thursday, the children enjoyed listening to our inspirational visitor and they challenged themselves to complete their sponsored circuits.

In English, we have looked at the four sentence types and apostrophe uses this week and have put them into practice when writing an argument between characters as well as a set of instructions.

In maths we have come to the end of the sequence on shape. The children have enjoyed this sequence of learning and the challenges of working mathematically with geometry. Our next sequence will be a statistics focus, learning about graphs, pie charts and finding the mean.

In history this week, the children wrote some fantastic diary entries from the perspective of an everyday person in the Shang Dynasty. They collected some research from the time period before writing a factually accurate piece of work. In science, the looked at the adaptations of animals and finally in PSHE today looked at money, thinking particularly about savings accounts and interest.

Reporting Absences

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.





Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
