Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year One have been reading '*Cinderella*' in our Curious Quests this week. We have been using adjectives to describe Cinderella's room. We have learned to write an invitation to The Palace Ball, making sure we included the vital information.

In Maths, we have continued working on numbers to 50. We have enjoyed the glorious sunshine and created some number lines on the playground. We have been developing our knowledge of place value, using dienes to create two-digit numbers to 50.

In PE we are learning tennis skills and this week it was lovely to get outside and practice with a racket and tennis ball. We worked on balance and ball control.

World Book Day was a highlight of the week and well done for creating such fantastic costumes, it was lovely to hear the children talking about their characters and the books that they most enjoy.

Year 2—Mr Slocombe

It's been a great start to the Spring season in Year 2 this week!

We have been busy creating our own daffodil based artwork in our creative area, linked to St David's Day. We also enjoyed learning about Shrove Tuesday - particularly the part where we got to eat some pancakes!

English has seen us learn about verb choices, conjunctions and possessive apostrophes. We are getting ready to write our own version of *Stuck!* next week.

In maths, we have been learning how to recognise and find thirds and quarters of numbers, we are becoming fractions experts!

Another great week in year 3. On Monday many of them were able to go to Exeter City ground to work on their football skills. Back in school, they have continued their work on fractions in maths, embedding unit and non unit and how they can be represented.

Year 4-Mr Walter

This week, Year 4 have started a non-fiction text looking into An Anthology of Intriguing Animals. So far, we have explored the information and how it has been presented finding our own facts about various different animals while exploring the differences between simple, compound and complex sentences.

A big thank you to Miss McLean for organising World Book Day for us yesterday. We enjoyed learning about some of the other characters across the whole school in assembly. We then had the opportunity to go up to Nursery and share some of their favourite stories with them before gaining the opportunity to be shown around to enjoy some continuous provision through the fantastic resources available. It was amazing to see the bonds developed through the power of reading. As always the costumes were fantastic throughout.

In maths, we have developed a further understanding of how to convert fractions and find their equivalents. Our next steps will be looking at how we add and subtract fractions.

Next Thursday, we have our Sports for Champions event so could everyone be wearing PE kit with suitable trainers to take part in the event. Thank you to all for the sponsors that have been returned both in school and online.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

An exciting week in Year 5 this week! In English, we have continued our sequence on Cloud Busting and have created our own shape poems following the pattern of the book. We have also been writing from the perspective of a character from the book and created a series of diary entries about what had happened to them in the book so far.

In Maths, we have completed our sequence on decimals and percentages and have been busy finding equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. We have just started our new sequence on area and perimeter and have been learning about how to find the perimeter of a rectilinear shape.

In History we have been learning about where the Vikings came from when they invaded Britain and the routes that they took. We also discussed where we would travel to if we were Vikings and why.

It was fantastic to see the children dressed up for world book day. The children enjoyed discussing their characters and favourite books. As a class we went to Owls class and spent some time reading to the children. It was fantastic to see the children integrate with the Year 5 and enjoy sharing different books. Have a great weekend Year 5.









Year 6—Miss McLean

Our World Book Day celebrations were a huge success yesterday, it was fantastic to see so many different character costumes and to spend time sharing books with other children in school.

In English, we continued with the Harry Potter sequence looking at descriptive writing this week. We spent some time revising expanded noun phrases and modal verbs before then writing a scene description from the perspective of a director.

We have continued learning about geometry, finding missing angles in triangles and compound shapes using the rules we learnt last week. We will finish this sequence next week by looking at polygons, circles and nets of 3D shapes.

In RE, we discussed the Hindu beliefs of karma, samsara, moksha and dharma. We made some board games to show how these ideas often link together and become part of one big cycle.

Practice for the Future Musicians event has started and the children are looking forward to this in a couple of weeks' time!

On Thursday 13th March 2025 we will welcome Kirsty Way as our Sports for Champions athlete.

Every child has been given a sponsorship form to try and help raise funds which will be split between the federation (60%) and the athlete (40%). The whole school will have the opportunity to ask questions and participate in a fitness circuit with Kirsty Way. She is a European champion in double mini trampolining (DMT). This is a fantastic opportunity for a lot of children to learn about a sport they otherwise might not get to engage with and hear the story of an athlete on their journey to try and achieve success. Kirsty has strong links with other aspects of gymnastics and will spend time with each class throughout the morning.
