We have finished most of our learning sequences and are looking forward to next week, having lots of Christmas activities planned. Mrs Fenemore asked us to make some Christmas cards for local businesses, which we did in groups. We then delivered some of the local ones and children took other cards to organisations who had been part of their lives this year. Year 4-Mr Walter

Year 4 enjoyed some food related activities this week. At the start of the week, we took part in a chocolate workshop to link with our history sequence of the Mayan civilisation. We learnt all about the history of the Theobroma cacao tree and how the Mayans used the cacao beans for trading and other purposes. We had a go at making our own bitter chocolate drink (xocolatl) before then creating our own chocolate slab. We also concluded our history sequence by looking into the Mayan letter and number system having a go at deciphering hieroglyphs. The food continued with our Christmas lunch on Wednesday, thank you to the kitchen for such a wonderful serving.

In English, we have started a sequence which focusses around a snow globe at Christmas. From this text we have created our own story maps and inferred the main characters' feelings throughout the story. In maths, we have continued to look at the perimeter of shapes and being able to convert between metres and kilometres.

It was great to have the opportunity to watch the fantastic KS1 Christmas play. Thank you to Mr Slocombe and Mrs Keast for inviting us to watch, everyone thoroughly enjoyed it.

This week we have finished off our teaching sequence on Kensukes Kingdom where we have written our own chapter for the book and have been editing this week looking how we can improve our sentences. We have also written a letter to Kensuke after being rescued. The children thought about what they wanted to say to him. On Wednesday, the children had a debate on the book about key questions that we thought of. "Was Kensuke keeping Michael prisoner on the island".

In Maths, we have started our new sequence on multiplication and have looked about multiplying two numbers using the area model.

In science, this week we have been looking at how rust is formed and the children created their own experiment to test how rust is formed and will spend the next week observing the results.

In maths, we are coming to the end of a sequence on converting units of measurement. The children have been working hard on this and have related back to their real-life experiences to support their understanding.

Finally, we are having a treat day on Monday to celebrate Year 6's hard work so far this year. They are also looking forward to our other Christmassy events next week such as the carol service and the school talent show.
