Year One have had so much fun thinking of rhyming words this week as part of our sequence of learning based on *Oi Frog*! We are creating our own rhyming text, thinking about what animals could eat. In Maths this week we have been learning how to subtract a part from a whole. Mrs Roberts has been teaching us how to use part-whole models and how to record some subtraction number sentences. We are also working on forming our numbers correctly.

Monday's dance workshop was great fun. The workshop linked to the text 'Funnybones' which we covered recently in our Drawing Club lessons.

Next Friday we have Tiverton Museum coming to school for the toy workshop and this will be a great opportunity for some hands-on learning

Year 4 have had a busy and exciting week. On Monday, their was fantastic feedback from Katie at Step Up & Dance for the enthusiasm the whole year group showed in their street dance workshop. This enthusiasm was shown again on Thursday afternoon in our intrasport school games with Year 3. It is a great opportunity for everyone have a go at a sport alongside our curriculum. In English, we have been thinking more in depth about the settings of our story and made comparisons between the real word and the dreamland our character goes to when meeting his ancestors. While in maths, we have consolidated our learning of the multiples of 3, 6 & 9 while finding multiplication and division facts about these numbers. In history, we explored different artefacts found to link with the Mayan civilisations and in science we wrote our hypothesis to conduct an experiment to show the process of the water cycle.

Finally, it was great to see so many grandparents at our grandparents lunch. The children enjoyed sharing the experience this afternoon.

### Year 5— Mr Saltearn

This week Year 5 travelled to Morwellham Quay they spent the day immersing themselves into Victorian life. We got to try on Victorian clothes and learnt about what the different clothes showed about Victorians. After the children attended a Victorian school where they spent a lesson learning what Victorian children learnt in school and about what a typical day looked like. After lunch we ventured down into the mines and learnt about what life was like in the mines for the workers and experienced how dark it was .

In English, we have been learning about using pronouns and have been correcting a piece of work that did not use any pronouns.

In Maths, we have continued our learning about fractions and have been comparing and order fractions.

### Year 6—Miss McLean

This week had a positive start for many in Year Six with their successful participation in the Utilita Cup event!

In English this week, we have focused on some grammar and punctuation featured that are used in the book My Secret War diary and have used them to write some of our own diary entries.

In maths, we have been focusing on fractions. We have learnt to simplify fractions as well as compare fractions with different numerators and denominators by using equivalent fractions.

In science this week, the children had a go at using electrical components to create complete and incomplete circuits. They used the symbols that we learnt about last week to draw circuit diagrams to represent what they had made.

Finally, in history, we learnt about the Battle of Bosworth in the War of the Roses which was the beginning of the Tudor period. The children created a storyboard to retell the events of the battle and how Henry VII became king.

### **Wraparound Care**

Flexible before and after school care available Monday to Friday each week during term time, with nutritious breakfasts and healthy snacks provided as well as appropriately supervised fun activities and games. Everybody is welcome, from Nursery to Year 6 with a range of different activities to suit the different age groups.

#### **Early Birds**

Early Birds Breakfast Club runs from 7.45am to 9.00am everyday. You may book as many days as you require. There are two options to choose, either with breakfast for £5.30 per session, or without breakfast for £4.30 per session.







#### **All Sorts**

All Sorts After School Club runs from 3.30pm to 5.30pm every day. You may book regular or ad-hoc sessions, whichever suits your requirements. You may book sessions for one hour for £5.30 (3.30pm - 4.30pm or 4.30pm - 5.00pm / 4.30pm - 5.30pm when booked in conjunction with an Enrichment Club), two hours for £10.60 (3.30pm-5.30pm).

### **Reporting Absences**

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.





Should I keep my

child off school?

### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



### but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

### Are you entitled?

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
