Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

It has been a very colourful week in Owls class this week as the children have been continuing with their theme of the seasons by learning about weather forecasts and rainbows!

They have enjoyed mixing primary colours to create their own rainbows, have had fun investigating light, colours and rainbows using torches, CDs and coloured magnifying glasses as well as enjoying some colour related water play and orbeez!

Our drawing club text this week has been 'Rosie's Hat.' Our vocabulary linked to this seasonal story has been: gust, astonished, flutter, swoop, occupation, weep and toss.

In maths the children have worked well to investigate capacity and mass and thoroughly enjoyed using the balance scales to compare different items and find ways to balance objects.

Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year One have been to the depths of the ocean this week in our Curious Quest. We have learned about sea creatures and divers. In our writing we have been working hard to spell tricky words correctly and to re-read our writing to check that it makes sense. We are helping our new 'Faithful Friends' to cross the Lava Lake by sending them our brilliant writing!

In Maths we are working on addition and subtraction within 20. This week we thought about how our prior knowledge of number bonds to 10 can be used to help us when adding numbers from 10 - 20. Being able to quickly recall number facts and number bonds is helping us to do this quickly.

In Art we are learning about Mondrian and this week we created some digital artwork on theipads using Paintz. We had a go at drawing lines and then filling in the spaces with primary colours. Next week we will be having a go at this with paints, rulers and black pens. This piece will then form our art exhibition display.









Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have been writing and publishing their own lift-the-flap Look Inside Space books this week, with some fantastic results! The children have been busy learning about space, culminating their writing into an information text. They have spent some time editing and improving their work before publishing and illustrating their own texts.

Maths has seen us explore the 10 timetable in more depth. We have learnt about the pattern that it follows and thought about the facts that link.

During science, we learnt about healthy diets, learning about different food groups and their impact.

Meanwhile, in geography we took a virtual tour of the village using Google maps, noticing and identifying human and physical geographical features!

When the rain had stopped, we were out and about in the village, linking back to what we had done in the classroom.

I am looking forward to another busy week next week, have a lovely weekend!

In science, we have been leaning about magnets and testing what is magnetic and what is not. It surprised us that the magnets were so strong that they nearly picked up the table. We found some metals were more attracted to the magnets than others.

Our new English sequence is 'Interview with a Tiger and other clawed beasts too'. We would like to practise our interviewing skills at home, choosing any animals, have you got any good questions to ask us?

In maths we have been learning about lengths, mm, cm, and m. We would love to do some measuring at home.

Year 4—Mr Walter

This week in English, Year 4 have started a new sequence titled 'Blue John'. We have explored some of the key vocabulary finding synonyms and antonyms for each word. We also created our own conscience alley to see if we thought he should stay with his mother (The Queen of Darkness) or leave to explore the outside world.

In maths, we have used some physical manipulatives to help us divide 2 digit numbers by a 1 digit number as well as continuing to reinforce the methods of multiplication.

In PE, we made the most of the bad weather at the beginning of the week and transferred our learnt netball skills into games of bench ball in the hall. There was some fantastic examples of pivoting and moving the ball forwards to find the best position to score.

In art, we have explored the different ways that water can be represented in preparation for our final piece that will go on display in the church throughout half term. This week, in geography we explored the uses of oil and where it comes from. This has set us up for next week for our trip to Plymouth next Thursday.

Finally, in RE we looked at the different representations of the Holy Trinity before coming up with our own which represents God The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

Year 5 have had a great week. In English, we have continued our sequence on short stories and have been adding adverbials into our sentences to add cohesion and add more detail to our writing, we have been taking three separate sentences and using adverbials to link them together.

On Thursday, we read the story Hunted and came up with some unanswered questions we had after reading it. The children then created their own story board for a preguel to the story Hunted.

In Maths, we have been finding a fraction of an amount. We have discussed how we can find the whole of a number and have been using bar models to help our explanations.

Science, we have been looking at what happens when we get older and diving into some stereotypes that surround growing older. As a group we discussed each one and decided if it was a stereotype or not.

PE we have continued our sequence on dance and the children have enjoyed adding their own chorography into their sequence.

Music, we have been learning the C and F chord on a ukulele.

Year six have enjoyed getting to know their new text in English this week 'A Wizard of Earthsea'. We talked about it being a fantasy fiction book and looked at some similarities it has to other stories of the same genre. The children have been getting to know the main characters in the story by looking at ways that an author creates them.

In maths we have continued with our learning about fractions, decimals and percentages, focusing this week on converting between the three. We played a bingo game and had a go at some puzzles to secure this knowledge.

Finally, in geography we looked at the human geography of South America by comparing populations, capital city sizes and life expectancy in each country. Next week, we look forward to welcoming a visitor to talk about life in South America.

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over		
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode		
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19		
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics		
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared		
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started		
Scabies	they've had their first treatment		
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics		
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
